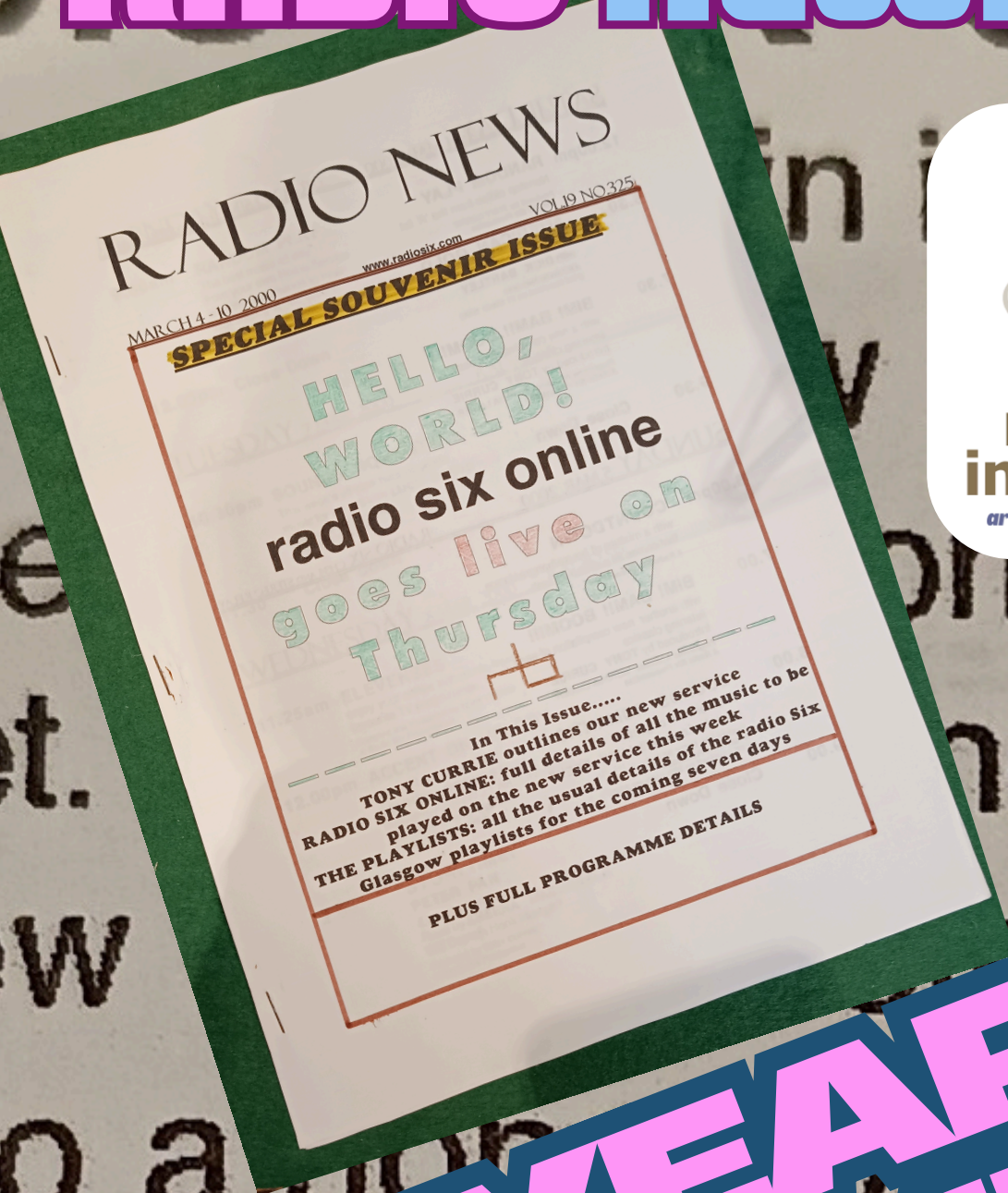

It's hard to believe that Radio Six International has been streaming on the internet more or less non stop (technical breakdowns have been very few and very far between) for 25 years. The service began at 1am on Thursday, 9th March 2000 with a four-hour programme of records introduced by Karin Spalter, repeated on a loop. A few months later, a four hour sequence of programmes replaced that, and listeners around the world could hear Sherlock Holmes stories, the TV Themes series "Sounds Visual", up to date dance music with Leo Currie's "Club Six" and the history of the radio jingle in "Jingles All The Way", which is being repeated on Saturday March 8th this year.
