

BOSWELL'S GALLOPING FARMERS - background to the series.

Sandy Barclay, an Ayrshire farmer's son, was a prizewinning ploughman. In 1915, however, he volunteered, along with many of his peers to join the Ayrshire (Earl of Carrick's Own) Yeomanry. This was a volunteer cavalry regiment largely comprised of Ayrshire farmers - hence their nickname Boswell's Galloping Farmers. In the summer of 1915, while on annual camp at Barry in Angus, they were suddenly de-mounted, trained in the arts of trench warfare, and sent to fight the Ottoman Empire ('Turkey' in common parlance) in a distant part of south-eastern Europe. They really did have to learn on the job, and this they did with honour and distinction. Sandy's memoir, written sixty years later, forms part of a collection of documents or monograph which capture the reality of day to day life in a struggle which ended in stalemate and which cost many lives. The story is a grim one, but is told with touches of humour by the pragmatic Sandy. The mongraph is entitled Boswell's Galloping Framers, — Ayrshire Yeoman at Gallipoli, October to December 1915 by Rob Close & William M Watson. It is available from Ayrshire Archaeological and Natural History Society.

Writers Jill Korn and Martin Gallagher have adapted Sandy Barclay's account into an series of six short audio plays, and having crowdfunded the production, these will be broadcast on Radio Six International at 18:30 every weeknight from Christmas Eve. It is a story that cries out to be told and we bring to life Sandy and some of his fellow soldiers through the medium of audio drama, which is accessible to sighted and visually challenged listeners alike.

Jill Korn adds, "When I set out to find a co-writer for Boswell's Galloping Farmers, I didn't really realise how lucky I was going to be. Marting Gallagher, who helped put the voice of Sandy out there, is also a musician and singer. He came up with The Galipoli Waltz which, for me anyway, encapsulates the sometimes desperate humour and even optimism of Sandy's account. Here it is, performed by Martin, with music arranged by David Simpson. It has a jaunty, but poignant music-hall feel to it."

After the transmission in Christmas week, the entire series will be repeated on a weekly basis in February.

A six part audio drama based on the memoir of Alexander (Sandy) Barclay, who fought in the infamous Gallipoli campaign of 1915. By turns brutal, horrific and funny, the series tells of the real experiences of the men who volunteered as cavalrymen in the Ayrshire Yeomanry, only to have their horses taken away. They were retained in trench warfare and sent to

Gallipoli (now in modern day Turkiye), where they were out manned, out gunned and outflanked at every turn.

But Sandy survived, and much later, recounts his experiences in this compelling drama series: "Sixty years it's been. I can't quite believe it myself. You live your life; you think it's all behind you. But it's still there, inside you, the sights, the sounds, and the smells of it all. Aye. The smells. I've read a lot about it, the Gallipoli campaign, — but I've never found anything that tells the story of what it was like for the ordinary ranker, the man behind the rifle and the grenade and what those of us that came out of it alive, lived through."


